The Integrity Club at Princess Nourah University is the first women's club to be established among the integrity clubs in the Kingdom in 1433/1434 AH by a decision from the National Anti-Corruption Commission and the Ministry of Higher Education, under the supervision and presidency of Dr. Ruqayya Nasrallah Niaz, with the aim of exporting the values of integrity and combating corruption in all its forms.

Princess Nourah Bint Abdul Rahman University, represented by the Nazaha Club of the Deanship of Student Affairs, won the first place in the third annual meeting of Nazaha Clubs for Educational Institutions in Al-Jawf, under the patronage of the Governor of Al-Jouf Region His Royal Highness Prince Faisal bin Nawaf bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, and in the presence of His Excellency the Director of Al-Jouf University Dr. Ismail bin Muhammad Al-Bishri, where the integrity club won as the most interactive and active club during the academic year 1439 AH at the level of all educational institutions in the Kingdom.

It also aims to enhance female students 'citizenship and the spirit of belonging through the principles, good values and good morals recommended by our religion and our Prophet Muhammad, may God bless him and grant him peace, and the club seeks to organize and sponsor student cultural and scientific activities in the field of integrity in line with the vision of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia 2030 , By developing

and defining mechanisms for the concepts of innovation, innovation and creativity, in order to achieve the vision of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques in reform and combating corruption to immunize society in general and the employees of educational institutions in particular.

Evaluation and support mechanism

Application conditions:

1. The project proposal is submitted according to the center's models (click here).
2. Attach the cv to the research team.
3. Send the proposal via email src-r@pnu.edu.sa pdf signed by the research team and another version in word format.
4. The number of pages of the proposal should not exceed (30) pages printed in Arabic.
5. The principal researcher is required to be at the rank of (assistant professor and above).
6. There is nothing wrong with the participation of researchers from inside and outside the Kingdom, with the aim of exchanging experiences and knowledge enrichment provided that the research team includes researchers from Princess Nourah Bint Abdul Rahman University.

7. The lead researcher must sign a declaration of knowledge on the distinctive publication within (WOS)

How to get support:

1. The researcher has completed the form of requesting the financing of the research project in full.

2. Research projects submitted by the researcher are arbitrated following the following procedures:

- The research plan sends two arbitrators to make their observations about: the research plan, its objectives, methodology, and importance, and the researcher is obliged to make any amendments requested by arbitration.

The amended chart is sent with the original scheme (before amendment) to the arbitrators to ensure that all required adjustments have been implemented.

- In the event of admission without modifications, the researcher/applicants will be addressed and informed of the center's approval to support the research project.

- If the arbitrators do not approve the project or receive an evaluation score of less than 85%, the center apologizes for accepting it.

Research projects are divided in terms of duration and amounts agreed to be funded into:

- Small businesses: a project that:
- The completion period does not exceed 12 months.
- The maximum funding is no more than SR 40,000
- His scientific production is no less than a scientific paper published in a scientific journal (WOS)
- Medium projects: a project that:
- The completion period does not exceed 12 months.
- The maximum funding is no more than a maximum of SAR 80,000.

- His scientific production is not less than two scientific papers published in a scientific journal (WOS)

Quality control procedures:

The Center oversees the arbitration of the tools used in the study.

- The Center follows the project in all stages through periodic follow-up reports.

The topics of the meeting began in the second session by talking about the scientific awards and their impact on the Saudi women's academic career, as well as the scientific merit of Saudi women in the process of empowering them in the light of vision 2030, and the cognitive impact that this benefit leaves locally, regionally and internationally, in addition to the role of academic and cultural institutions and research centers in motivating and encouraging female researchers to obtain scientific awards, and to provide opportunities for scientific excellence internally and externally to be an actual translation of the aspirations of our dear country at this stage in support of excellence For me, innovation and innovation.

The event featured a visual presentation on the achievements of Saudi women locally and globally, and the impact of their participation in building the knowledge economy through global indicators on monitoring the role of women in different areas.
