Course Objectives:	Throughout this course we will study issues and evidence regarding the role of psychological factors in health and illness from theoretical, scientific, applied, and personal avenues of inquiry. The course offers introduction approaches to that psychotherapy fall into five broad categories, according to APA: Psychoanalysis and psychodynamic therapies; Behavior therapy; Cognitive therapy; Humanistic therapy; Integrative or holistic therapy. The course offers initial approach to cognitive and behavior psychotherapies; issues of management related to chronic and terminal illness; psychological techniques in treatment and rehabilitation of physical illness; Cognitive-behavioral approaches to health-behavior change; support for the dying and bereaved; pain relief and management; coping techniques, distraction, and guided imagery. In the practical part of this course, students will familiarize themselves with the different ccommunications in medical settings, Practitioner-patient relationship/interaction, as well as School of Psychotherapy: (Psychotherapeutic techniques in relation to particular problem e.g., pain, headache, stress).
